THE ACT OF INSTALLATION

The Presiding Minister

The Congregation being seated the Presiding
Minister shall say:—

To the Congregation

We are met in the Name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, at the request of this Church and as representatives of the fellowship of the Churches of the Baptist Order, that we may commit to our brother in Christ, the Reverend William Arthen Edwards, the charge and care of this Church and Congregation.

And now, that this church of Christ may fully understand your mind and purpose in the Holy Ministry, and that you may be confirmed therein, will you answer the questions we ask you in the name of God and His Church:

(1) Jesus said: "Go ye therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit; teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I commanded you; and lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world."

Do you take this as your commission, with solemn purpose to unfold to men the teaching of Jesus Christ?

Response: That I most solemnly do.

(2) I exhort first of all that supplications, prayers, intercessions and thanksgivings be made for all men, that we may lead a quiet life in all godliness and gravity.

Will you be constant in public and private prayers, devout and reverent in the conduct of the services of the House of God?

Response: I will do so, the Lord being my helper.

(3) Every scripture inspired of God is profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, perfectly equipped for every good work.

Will you diligently read and study God's Holy Word as contained in the Scriptures?

Response: I will do so in all sincerity.

(4) Tend the flock of God, excercising the oversight thereof, not of constraint, but willingly; not yet for base gain, but with a cheerful mind, not as lording it over the charge allotted to you, but making yourself an example to the flock.

Will you seek to fulfil this high calling with wisdom, diligence and love?

Response: It is my purpose so to do.

(5) Jesus saith to Simon Peter: "Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou me more than these?" He saith unto Him: "Yea, Lord; Thou knowest that I love Thee." He saith unto him: "Feed My lambs."

Will you care for the lambs of the flock, tending and leading them in the spirit of the Good Shepherd?

Response: Such, as I have opportunity, shall be my delight.

(6) I charge thee, in the sight of God and of Jesus Christ, Who shall judge the quick and the dead, at His appearing and His Kingdom preach the word, be instant in season, out of season, reprove, rebuke, exhort, with all long suffering and teaching.

Will you thus do the work of an evangelist and prepare the way of the Lord?

Response: God helping me, I will.

Then shall the Presiding Minister say:

In the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ, the only Head of the Church, I declare you, William Arthen Edwards, to be the appointed Minister of this Church, and I commend you to God and to the Word of His Grace ,which is able to make you perfect unto all good works. In token of which Induction I now give you the right hand of fellowship.
